Advancing technology and a need for an eco-friendly energy source drives Alternative Power Systems' goal to bring renewable energy into everyday use. Since the evaluation, the Somervilles have hired new employees, installed new contracts and are pursuing stimulus projects. They are very satisfied with their business analysis, the overall results and recommendations provided.

The MBA team's recommendations included: evaluate the message of the company logo; improve the company website to be more customer friendly, including testimonials and cost-savings calculators; improve customer relationships by offering annual site inspections;

installation; and keep current on all licensing requirements.
