After 16 years working as a master esthetician, spa director and educator for Aveda, Michelle Scott Cunninghame knew it was time to start her own business. She wanted to be able to create a space to live and work in, while working for herself. It was a natural progression personally and professionally.

After moving back to Utah from Kauai, Hawaii, Cunninghame said she decided to give starting a small business a try. After telling a friend about her plans, the friend recommended the Ogden Small Business Development Center (SBDC) and the Start Smart class being held there.

The SBDC helped me realize what steps I needed to take to get started, including creating a business plan and a profit and loss statement projected over three years," she said.

That was when Free Spirit Holistic Mountain Spa began to take shape. Cunninghame had a hard time in the beginning finding the best location for her spa, negotiating a lease and getting a loan from the bank. Eventually she found the perfect spot in Eden, Utah.

Added to her setbacks was the onset of the national economic recession during her loan application process. It turned out to be a blessing in disguise, Cunninghame said, forcing her to take a good look at projected costs and scale back. Even though she had to start out smaller than planned, Cunninghame is happy she doesn't have a huge loan to pay back.
